## PURPOSE

The purpose of this Casebook is to provide detailed examples and explanations for the application of Suspensions. In no way is it the intention of Hockey Saskatchewan to replace our Handbook, but rather to provide additional documentation and education to our membership.

We highly recommend that coaches and managers keep a copy of this document and become familiar with it, so as to better work within the rules and regulations of hockey in Saskatchewan. It will be located on the Hockey Saskatchewan website as well as our App.

The Hockey Saskatchewan Coordinator of Discipline has the ability to issue discipline for any action on and off the ice by any Hockey Saskatchewan registered participant that is not covered by Hockey Canada/Hockey Saskatchewan playing rules.

Disciplinary offenses on game sheets for any sanctioned Hockey Saskatchewan game may only be altered with the approval of the Hockey Saskatchewan Coordinator of Discipline.

The Hockey Saskatchewan Coordinator of Discipline shall only address offenses occurring in Exhibition games, Tournaments, and Hockey Saskatchewan playoff games. League Executives address offenses occurring in Preseason, League, and League playoff games, with the exception of 11.4 and 11.5 offenses.

NOTE: "Preseason" games are defined as those that involve two teams from the same league who play a game prior to scheduled League play beginning. Preseason games must be scheduled through the League Executive.
"Exhibition" games are defined as those that involve two teams from different Leagues prior to, or following the start of, League play.
6.09.01
a) The Minimum Suspension guidelines in Regulation 6.09.04 is the Minimum guideline for the application of a suspension of team members.

Example:
i) A player receives a 7.6 c) (Match penalty for Head Contact) in the second period of a game. The player will receive a minimum four (4) game suspension; no less.
b) Leagues may extend the basic suspension(s), however they shall not reduce the Hockey Saskatchewan Minimum guideline.

Example:
i) A player receives an 11.1 e) (Game Misconduct for Abuse of Officials) in the first period of a League game. It is this player's $2^{\text {nd }}$ Game Misconduct for an 11.1 e) this season, so the minimum suspension is one (1) game for the 11.1 e) plus two
(2) games for a second infraction of an 11.1 e) in a season for a total suspension
of three (3) games. The League decides to add an additional one (1) game suspension to the total to try and curb this type of behavior in League play. The League is well within their rights to add additional games, however, they cannot reduce the Hockey Saskatchewan minimum guideline.
c) These Minimum Suspension guidelines are to be applied to all hockey played in the Minor and Female divisions of Hockey Saskatchewan.
d) The game in which any of the penalties assessed fall under Hockey Saskatchewan Minimum Suspension guidelines, shall not be counted in the length of suspension.

Example:
i) A player receives a Major penalty and Game Misconduct for cross-checking in the second period of a game. The player is removed from the game and is given a minimum one (1) game suspension. The game the player is removed from does not count towards the suspension as the Game Misconduct removed the player for the remainder of the game in which the infraction occurred.
ii) A coach receives an 11.2 e) (Game Misconduct for Abuse of Officials) with four (4) minutes remaining in the third period. The coach is removed from the game and is given a minimum three (3) game suspension...two (2) games for the 11.2 e) infraction, and one (1) game for the Game Misconduct in the last 10 minutes of the game. The game the coach is removed from does not count towards the suspension as the Game Misconduct removed the coach for the remainder of the game in which the infraction occurred.
e) It is the responsibility of each team manager and/or coach to ensure the team member(s) sit out their appropriate suspensions. If in doubt as to the relevant suspension, contact the Hockey Saskatchewan Coordinator of Discipline. The Hockey Saskatchewan Coordinator of Discipline may impose a time limit on a suspension, as opposed to a number of games, under special circumstances.

Example:
i) A U13 team is attending a weekend tournament. On Saturday morning in Game \#2 of the Tournament, one of their players receives a Major penalty and Game Misconduct for Slashing in the first period. The team plays another game that same afternoon. It is the responsibility of the team manager/coach to understand that the player receives a one (1) game suspension for the infraction. They can use the Hockey Saskatchewan website or free App to confirm the player is indeed suspended prior to their next game.

f) Any suspension involving a "length of time" will be applied with the Actual Playing Season which is October $1^{\text {st }}$ to March $31^{\text {st }}$.

### 6.09.02 Application Guidelines of Suspensions

a) Suspensions by Hockey Saskatchewan of any registered referee, player, coach or team official may include a suspension that will not allow such suspended person to participate in the game of hockey in any capacity. The following guidelines apply:
i) The suspensions from all aspects of hockey games would apply to all suspensions issued for breach of the Hockey Saskatchewan Bylaws and Regulations, as well as all suspensions issued under Hockey Canada/Hockey Saskatchewan Playing Rules 2.2; 2.2 c); 11.2; 11.3; 11.4; 11.5 i), ii), iii), and iv).

Example:

1. A player receives a five (5) game suspension for a 11.4 Discrimination offense. The same player is also a registered Official. She cannot officiate any hockey Games until her five (5) game suspension is served as a player.
ii) Unless specified otherwise, suspensions resulting from violation of Hockey Canada/Hockey Saskatchewan playing rules, would only suspend the referee, player, or team official from participating in the game of hockey in the capacity at which he/she received their suspension.

Example:

1. A coach receives a one (1) game suspension for a 11.1 e) Abuse of Officials. The same coach is also a registered Official and has a scheduled game to officiate the next evening. The coach can officiate this game as his suspension only applied to coaching and not to all aspects of hockey games.
b) While a player or team official is serving their suspension, they may not participate with the Team in any capacity during games.
c) A suspended player cannot be present on the player's bench however they are allowed in the team's dressing room.
d) A suspended team official cannot be present in his/her team's dressing room prior to, during, or following the game(s) they are suspended from or be on the player's bench.

## Team officials who violate this will be dealt with by the Hockey Saskatchewan Coordinator of Discipline.

e) i) A player/team official is suspended until the suspension is served with the team where the infraction occurred (certified, carded or affiliate team).

Example:

1. A U15 Female player is registered on a Female U15 team and affiliated to a Female U18 team. While playing as an affiliate in a U18 game on Saturday night, she received a Major penalty and Game Misconduct for boarding, resulting in a one (1) game suspension. Her U15 team has a game the next day and also on Tuesday. She cannot play any games with the U15 team until her suspension is served with the U18 team, and the U15 games do not count towards her suspension. The U18 team does not play again until Wednesday, so she will have to miss both U15 games and then sit out the U18 game on Wednesday in order to serve her one (1) game suspension.
2. A Male U13 player is registered on a U13 team in his hometown of Wawota. He has also been registered on the Carlyle U13 Provincial team as Wawota did not enter provincials this season. On February $10^{\text {th }}$, while playing a Provincial game with Carlyle, he received a Major penalty and Game Misconduct for Head Contact, resulting in a one (1) game suspension. His next Provincial game with Carlyle is not until February $18^{\text {th }}$, however his Wawota team has two league games on February $13^{\text {th }}$ and $15^{\text {th }}$. He cannot play any games with Wawota until his suspension is served with Carlyle, and the Wawota games do not count towards his suspension. He will miss both league games with Wawota and then sit out the Provincial game on the $18^{\text {th }}$ with Carlyle in order to serve his one (1) game suspension.
ii) If the team where the infraction occurred has played its last game, then the suspension may be completed with the other team.

Example:

1. A Female U18 player is registered on the Weyburn Female U18 AA team and affiliated to the Weyburn Female U18 AAA team. On March 3 ${ }^{\text {rd }}$, while playing a playoff game as an affiliate for the U18 AAA team, she received a 11.2 f) Gross Misconduct resulting in a four (4) game suspension. She cannot play any games with the U18 AA team until she serves the suspension with the U18 AAA team. However, the U18 AAA team loses out of playoffs on March $6^{\text {th }}$, ending their season. She has served one (1) of the four (4) games necessary for her
suspension, but can now serve the remaining three (3) games with the U18 AA team in playoffs because the team where the suspension occurred has played its last game of the season.
iii) The player suspension must be listed on game sheets.
iv) The player/team official shall not be included as one of the maximum number of players.
f) Suspensions cannot be served in Preseason, Exhibition, Cancelled or Forfeited Games and suspended players cannot play in Preseason or Exhibition games.

NOTE: Suspended players can participate in Preseason games at the U18 AAA; U13/U15/AA 15/U18 AA categories prior to the Team's roster being finalized and submitted to Hockey Saskatchewan within the timelines outlined in Regulation 6.04.11 d) and 6.04.12 b).

Example:
i) A Male U11 player receives a one (1) game suspension for a Major penalty and Game Misconduct for Slashing. The U11 team's next scheduled league game is a week later, however, the coach has scheduled an Exhibition game before that. The player cannot participate in the Exhibition game and it does not count towards his suspension. He must miss the Exhibition game and then sit out the next league game in order to serve his suspension.
ii) A Male U15 player receives a three (3) game suspension for a Match penalty in his last game of the season. The following fall, he is trying out for his hometown U15 AA team. He is allowed to participate in try-outs as well as any Preseason games the team has scheduled before their September $20^{\text {th }}$ deadline to register with Hockey Saskatchewan. The U15 AA team's first regular season game is scheduled for October $1^{\text {st }}$ with two Exhibition games prior to that. The player cannot participate in the Exhibition games and his three (3) game suspension will start on the October $1^{\text {st }}$ league game.
g) Suspensions may only be served in regular scheduled league games, Hockey Saskatchewan playoff games or league playoff games and sanctioned tournaments where entry or scheduling is made prior to the suspension.

Example:
i) A Male U18 player received a six (6) game suspension on December $21^{\text {st }}$ for his
third Major penalty and Game Misconduct, which happened to be in the last ten minutes of the game. Over the Christmas break, the U18 coach found an extra Tournament for the team to attend on January 8-10. The team has three league games between Christmas and January $8^{\text {th }}$ so the player will be able to serve three (3) of his six (6) game suspension. However, because this tournament was not scheduled prior to the player receiving his suspension, and because he has not yet served the entirety of the suspension, he cannot participate in the tournament and the games do not count towards his suspension.
h) Suspensions for violations of the Hockey Canada/Hockey Saskatchewan rules and regulations must be served in the next game or games the player/team official participates in.
i) Suspension for violation of league rules (i.e.: accumulation of penalty minutes; misconducts; game misconducts; fighting majors; CFB's; HC's; etc.) may be implemented at the League's discretion.

Example:
i) The Northeast Minor Hockey League has a league rule in the U15 and U18 divisions that states, "Any player that reaches fifty (50) penalty minutes in the season will receive an automatic one (1) game suspension". The League can implement this suspension over and above any Hockey Saskatchewan minimum guidelines.
j) Any suspension imposed upon any player, coach, or team official by the officials of any League or Association registered with Hockey Saskatchewan shall be given full recognition by Hockey Saskatchewan.

### 6.09.03 Record Keeping of Suspensions

All registered Leagues under Hockey Saskatchewan must submit a copy of all correspondence involving suspensions by that League within the Hockey Saskatchewan online Suspension tracking website. All leagues must abide by the Minimum Suspension guidelines as set out in 6.09.04.
6.09.04
a) Physical Abuse of Officials

Any player, coach, manager, trainer or stick person assessed a penalty under Rule 11.5 of the Hockey Canada Rule Book is to be indefinitely suspended until the matter is dealt with by the Hockey Saskatchewan Chair of Discipline.

## d) Fighting

## g) Game Misconduct

In all hockey (with the exception of Junior A), any player or team official who is assessed a Game Misconduct penalty in the last ten (10) minutes of regular time, at any time in overtime, or after the conclusion of the game and prior to the player or team official entering the dressing room, shall automatically be suspended for the next regular scheduled league, playoff, Hockey Saskatchewan Provincial Playoff or sanctioned tournament game. Players receiving a game misconduct under this rule during their last game of the season must serve the suspension in their first league or sanctioned tournament game in the next season.

Example:
i) A player receives a major penalty and game misconduct for boarding with 1:29 remaining in the $3^{\text {rd }}$ period. Player receives:

5 minute major - One (1) game
GM in the last 10 minutes - One (1) game
Total suspension - Two (2) games
ii) A coach receives a 11.2 e) game misconduct for abuse of officials with 9:49 remaining in the $3^{\text {rd }}$ period. Coach receives:
11.2 e) -
Two (2) games

GM in the last 10 minutes -
Total suspension -

One (1) game
Three (3) games

Any Gross Misconduct or Match penalty in the last ten (10) minutes of a game receives an extra Game Suspension in addition to the suspension for the Gross Misconduct or Match penalty.

Example:
i) A player receives a Match penalty for checking from behind with 7:31 remaining in the $3^{\text {rd }}$ period. Player receives:

Match for CFB - Four (4) games
Match in the last 10 minutes One (1) game
Total suspension - Five (5) games
h) Multiple Game Misconducts

## i) Unsanctioned Event Participation

b) Leagues may extend the basic suspension(s), however they shall not reduce the Hockey Saskatchewan Minimum guideline.

Example:
i) A player receives an 11.1 e) (Game Misconduct for Abuse of Officials) in the first period of a League game. It is this player's $2^{\text {nd }}$ Game Misconduct for an 11.1 e) this season, so the minimum suspension is one (1) game for the 11.1 e) plus two (2) games for a second infraction of an 11.1 e) in a season for a total suspension

i) A player receives a Major penalty and Game Misconduct for cross-checking in the second period of a game. The player is removed from the game and is given a minimum one (1) game suspension. The game the player is removed from does not count towards the suspension as the Game Misconduct removed the player for the remainder of the game in which the infraction occurred.
ii) A coach receives an 11.2 (Game Misconduct for Abuse of Officials) with four (4) minutes remaining in the third period. The coach is removed from the game and is given a minimum two (2) game suspension...one (1) game for the 11.2 infraction, and one (1) game for the Game Misconduct in the last 10 minutes of the game. The game the coach is removed from does not count towards the suspension as the Game Misconduct removed the coach for the remainder of the game in which the infraction occurred.
e) It is the responsibility of each team manager and/or coach to ensure the team member(s) sit out their appropriate suspensions. If in doubt as to the relevant suspension, contact the Hockey Saskatchewan Coordinator of Discipline. The Hockey Saskatchewan Coordinator of Discipline may impose a time limit on a suspension, as opposed to a number of games, under special circumstances.

Example:
i) A Senior team is playing back-to-back League games on Saturday and Sunday. In the Saturday game, one of their players receives a Major penalty and Game Misconduct for Head Contact in the first period. It is the responsibility of the team manager/coach to understand that the player receives a one (1) game suspension for the infraction. They can use the Hockey Saskatchewan website or free App to confirm the player is indeed suspended prior to their game on Sunday.

f) Any suspension involving a "length of time" will be applied with the Actual Playing Season which is October $1^{\text {st }}$ to March $31^{\text {st }}$.
4.09.02 Application Guidelines of Suspensions
a) Suspensions by Hockey Saskatchewan of any registered referee, player, coach or team official may include a suspension that will not allow such suspended person to participate in the game of hockey in any capacity. The following guidelines apply:

1. A player receives a five (5) game suspension for a 11.4 Discrimination. The same player is also a registered Official. He cannot officiate any hockey games until his five (5) game suspension is served as a player.
ii) Unless specified otherwise, suspensions resulting from violation of Hockey Canada/Hockey Saskatchewan playing rules, would only suspend the referee, player, or team official from participating in the game of hockey in the capacity at which he/she received their suspension.

Example:

1. A coach receives a one (1) game suspension for a 11.1 e) Abuse of Officials. The same coach is also a registered Official and has a scheduled game to officiate the next evening. The coach can officiate this game as his suspension only applied to coaching and not to all aspects of hockey games.
b) While a player or team official is serving their suspension, they may not participate with the Team in any capacity during games.
c) A suspended player cannot be present on the player's bench however they are allowed in the team's dressing room.
d) A suspended team official cannot be present in his/her team's dressing room prior to, during, or following the game(s) they are suspended from or be on the player's bench.

Team officials who violate this will be dealt with by the Hockey Saskatchewan
Coordinator of Discipline.
e) i) A player/team official is suspended until the suspension is served with the team where the infraction occurred (certified, carded or affiliate team).

Example:

1. A Senior player is registered on the Senior team in his hometown of Wadena. He has also been registered on the Wynyard Senior Provincial team as Wadena did not enter provincials this season. On February 10 ${ }^{\text {th }}$, while playing a Provincial game with Wynyard, he received a Major penalty and Game Misconduct for Checking from Behind, resulting in a one (1) game suspension. His next Provincial game with Wynyard is not until February $18^{\text {th }}$, however his Wadena team has two league games on February $13^{\text {th }}$ and $15^{\text {th }}$. He cannot play any games with Wadena until his suspension is served with Wynyard, and the Wadena games do not count towards his suspension. He will miss both league games with Wadena and then sit out the Provincial game on the $18^{\text {th }}$ with Wynyard in order to serve his one (1) game suspension.
ii) If the team where the infraction occurred has played its last game, then the suspension may be completed with the other team.

Example:

1. A U18 player is registered on the Wilkie U18 team and affiliated to the Wilkie Senior team. On March $3^{\text {rd }}$, while playing a playoff game as an affiliate for the Senior team, he received a 11.2 f) Gross Misconduct resulting in a two (2) game suspension. He cannot play any games with the U18 team until he serves the suspension with the Senior team. However, the Senior team loses out of playoffs on March $6^{\text {th }}$, ending their season. He has served one (1) of the two (2) games necessary for his suspension, but can now serve the remaining one (1) game with the U18 team in playoffs because the team where the suspension occurred has played its last game of the season.
iii) The player suspension must be listed on game sheets.
iv) The player/team official shall not be included as one of the maximum number of players.
f) Suspensions cannot be served in Preseason, Exhibition, Cancelled or Forfeited Games
and suspended players cannot play in Preseason or Exhibition games.

Example:
i) A Senior player receives a one (1) game suspension for an 11.1 Game Misconduct. The Senior team's next scheduled league game is a week later, however, the coach has scheduled an Exhibition game before that. The player cannot participate in the Exhibition game and it does not count towards his suspension. He must miss the Exhibition game and then sit out the next league game in order to serve his suspension.
g) Suspensions may only be served in regular scheduled league games, Hockey Saskatchewan playoff games or league playoff games and sanctioned tournaments where entry or scheduling is made prior to the suspension.
h) Suspensions for violations of the Hockey Canada/Hockey Saskatchewan rules and regulations must be served in the next game or games the player/team official participates in.
i) Suspension for violation of league rules (i.e.: accumulation of penalty minutes; misconducts; game misconducts; fighting majors; CFB's; HC's; etc.) may be implemented at the League's discretion.

Example:
i) The Big 6 Senior Hockey League has a league rule that states, "Any player that reaches one hundred (100) penalty minutes in the season will receive an automatic one (1) game suspension". The League can implement this suspension over and above any Hockey Saskatchewan minimum guidelines.
j) Any suspension imposed upon any player, coach, or team official by the officials of any League or Association registered with Hockey Saskatchewan shall be given full recognition by Hockey Saskatchewan.

## JUNIOR

The Hockey Saskatchewan Coordinator of Discipline has the ability to issue discipline for any action on and off the ice by any Hockey Saskatchewan registered participant that is not covered by Hockey Canada/Hockey Saskatchewan playing rules.

Disciplinary offenses on game sheets for any sanctioned Hockey Saskatchewan game may only be altered with the approval of the Hockey Saskatchewan Coordinator of Discipline.

Executives for the SJHL, PJHL, Junior C and Female Junior Leagues address offenses occurring in exhibition, preseason, league and league playoff games, except for 11.4 and 11.5 offenses. The Executives of the Leagues will consult with the Hockey Saskatchewan Coordinator of Discipline for all 11.4 and 11.5 offenses.

NOTE: "Preseason" games are defined as those that involve two teams from the same league who play a game prior to scheduled League play beginning. Preseason games must be scheduled through the League Executive.
"Exhibition" games are defined as those that involve two teams from different Leagues prior to, or following the start of, League play.

### 5.09.01 Junior A/B

a) The Saskatchewan Junior Hockey League (Junior A) and the Prairie Junior Hockey League (Junior B) will follow the Minimum Suspension Guidelines of Hockey Canada as listed in Regulation 5.09.02.
b) The Minimum Suspension guidelines in Regulation 5.09 .04 is the Minimum guideline for the application of a suspension of team members.
c) Leagues may extend the basic suspension(s); however, they shall not reduce the Hockey Canada Minimum guideline.

## Example:

i) A player on the Nipawin Hawks receives an 11.2 f) Gross Misconduct for abuse of an official. The minimum suspension for this infraction is two (2) games.

However, the SJHL decides to add an extra game to make the total suspension three (3) games due to the severity of what was said. The League can decide to add to the minimum if they so choose.
d) The game in which any of the penalties assessed fall under Hockey Saskatchewan Minimum Suspension guidelines, shall not be counted in the length of the suspension.

## Example:

i) A player on the Delisle Chiefs receives an 11.3 c) Match penalty for spitting with 8:35 remaining in the first period. The player is removed from that game and it does not count towards the minimum five (5) game suspension the player received for that infraction.
e) It is the responsibility of each team manager and/or coach to ensure the team member(s) sit out their appropriate suspensions. If in doubt as to the relevant suspension, contact the applicable League President.

### 5.09.02 Application Guidelines of Suspensions

a) Suspensions by Hockey Saskatchewan of any registered referee, player, coach, or team official may include a suspension that will not allow such suspended person to participate in the game of hockey in any capacity. The following guidelines apply:
i) The suspension from all aspects of hockey games apply to all suspensions issued for breach of the Hockey Saskatchewan Bylaws or Regulations, as well as all suspensions issued under Hockey Canada/Hockey Saskatchewan Playing Rule 2.2; 2.2 c); 11.2; 11.3; 11.4; 11.5 i), ii), iii) and iv).

Example:

1. A player receives a five (5) game suspension for a 11.4 Discrimination. The same player is also a registered Official. He cannot officiate any hockey games until his five (5) game suspension is served as a player.
ii) Unless specified otherwise, suspensions resulting from violation of Hockey Canada/Hockey Saskatchewan playing rules, would only suspend the referee, player, or team official from participating in the game of hockey in the capacity at which he/she received their suspension.

Example:

1. A coach receives a one (1) game suspension for a 11.2 e) Abuse of Officials. The
same coach is also a registered Official and has a scheduled game to officiate the next evening. The coach can officiate this game as his suspension only applied to coaching and not to all aspects of hockey games.
b) While a player or team official is serving their suspension, they may not participate with the Team in any capacity during games.
c) A suspended player cannot be present on the player's bench however they are allowed in the team's dressing room.
d) A suspended Team Official cannot be present in his/her team's dressing room prior to, during, or following the game(s) they are suspended from or be on the player's bench. Team Officials who violate this will be dealt with by the respective League Executive.
e) Suspensions cannot be served in Preseason, Exhibition, Cancelled or Forfeited Games and suspended players cannot play in Preseason or Exhibition games.

NOTE: Suspended players can participate in Preseason games prior to the Team's roster being finalized and submitted to Hockey Saskatchewan.

Example:
i) An 18-year-old player, who graduated from U18 the previous spring, received a three (3) game suspension during his last U18 game. That player is now trying out for the Weyburn Junior A Red wings in the fall. As the player is trying to make the team, he is allowed to participate in preseason games up until the time he has secured a roster spot. If and when that happens, he would then not be allowed to participate in any further preseason games and would have to sit until his suspension is completely served in League play.
f) Suspensions may only be served in regular scheduled league games, Hockey Saskatchewan playoff games or league playoff games and sanctioned tournaments where entry or scheduling is made prior to the suspension.
g) Suspensions for violations of the Hockey Canada/Hockey Saskatchewan rules and regulations must be served in the next game or games the player/team official participates in.
h) Suspensions for violation of league rules (i.e.: accumulation of penalty minutes; misconducts; game misconducts; fighting majors; CFB's; HC's; etc.) may be implemented at the League's discretion.

Example:
i) A player registered with the Estevan Bruins received a minor and misconduct for Head Contact in a game in January. No suspension is given for this penalty as per Hockey Canada minimum guidelines. However, the SJHL gives the player a one (1) game suspension due to this being his $3^{\text {rd }}$ such penalty call this season.
i) Any suspension imposed upon any player, coach, or team official by the officials of any League or Association registered with Hockey Saskatchewan shall be given full recognition by Hockey Saskatchewan.

a) The Minimum Suspension guidelines in Regulation 5.09 .07 is the Minimum guideline for the application of a suspension of team members.
b) Leagues may extend the basic suspension(s); however, they shall not reduce the Hockey Saskatchewan Minimum guideline.

Example:
i) A player on the Wolseley Junior C team receives an 11.2 f) Gross Misconduct for abuse of an official. The minimum suspension for this infraction is two (2) games. However, the Junior C League decides to add an extra game to make the total suspension three (3) games due to the severity of what was said. The League can decide to add to the minimum if they so choose.
c) These Minimum Suspension guidelines are to be applied to all hockey played in the Junior C and Junior Female divisions of Hockey Saskatchewan.
d) The game in which any of the penalties assessed fall under Hockey Saskatchewan Minimum Suspension guidelines, shall not be counted in the length of the suspension.

Example:
i) A player on the Saskatoon Junior Female Team receives an 11.3 c) Match penalty for spitting with $8: 35$ remaining in the first period. The player is removed from that game and it does not count towards the minimum five (5) game suspension the player received for that infraction.
e) It is the responsibility of each team manager and/or coach to ensure the team member(s) sit out their appropriate suspensions. If in doubt as to the relevant suspension, contact the applicable League President.
f) Any suspension involving a "length of time" will be applied from the beginning of League play for the League the Team is registered with until March 31 ${ }^{\text {st }}$.
5.09.06 Application Guidelines of Suspensions
a) Suspensions by Hockey Saskatchewan of any registered referee, player, coach, or team official may include a suspension that will not allow such suspended person to
participate in the game of hockey in any capacity. The following guidelines apply:
i) The suspension from all aspects of hockey games would apply to all suspensions issued for breach of the Hockey Saskatchewan Bylaws or Regulations, as well as all suspensions issued under Hockey Canada/Hockey Saskatchewan Playing Rule 2.2; 2.2 c); 11.2; 11.3; 11.4; 11.5 i), ii), iii), and iv).

Example:

1. A player receives a five (5) game suspension for a 11.4 Discrimination. The same player is also a registered Official. He cannot officiate any hockey games until his five (5) game suspension is served as a player.
ii) Unless specified otherwise, suspensions resulting from violation of Hockey Canada/Hockey Saskatchewan playing rules, would only suspend the referee, player, or team official from participating in the game of hockey in the capacity at which he/she received their suspension.

## Example:

1. A Female Junior player receives a one (1) game suspension for a 11.2 e) Abuse of Officials. The same player is also a registered coach of a Female U15 team and has a scheduled game to coach the next evening. The player can coach this game as her suspension only applied to playing and not to all aspects of hockey games.
b) While a player or team official is serving their suspension, they may not participate with the Team in any capacity during games.
c) A suspended player cannot be present on the player's bench however they are allowed in the team's dressing room.
d) A suspended Team Official cannot be present in his/her team's dressing room prior to, during, or following the game(s) they are suspended from or be on the player's bench. Team Officials who violate this will be dealt with by the respective League Executive.
e) i) A player/team official is suspended until the suspension is served with the team where the infraction occurred (certified, carded or affiliate team).

Example:

1. A player is registered with the Lumsden Junior C team and affiliated to
the Lumsden Senior team. While playing a game as an affiliate with the Senior team on December $11^{\text {th }}$, the player receives a one (1) game suspension. The Senior team does not play again until December $16^{\text {th }}$, however, the Junior C team has a game on December $14^{\text {th }}$. The player cannot play the Junior C game on the $14^{\text {th }}$, and it does not count towards his suspension. He must then sit out the Senior game on the $16^{\text {th }}$ to serve his suspension before he can play any games with the Junior C team.
ii) If the team where the infraction occurred has played its last game, then the suspension may be completed with the other team.

Example:

1. A player is registered with the Lumsden Junior C team and affiliated to the Lumsden Senior team. While playing a game as an affiliate with the Senior team on February $27^{\text {th }}$, the player receives a one (1) game suspension. In that game, the Lumsden Senior team loses out of playoffs and is now done for the season. The player can therefore serve the suspension with the Junior C team who is still in playoffs.
iii) The Player suspension must be listed on game sheets.
iv) The player/team official shall not be included as one of the maximum number of players.
f) Suspensions cannot be served in Preseason, Exhibition, Cancelled or Forfeited Games and suspended players cannot play in Preseason or Exhibition games.

NOTE: Suspended players can participate in Preseason games at the Junior C and Junior Female categories prior to the Team's roster being finalized and submitted to Hockey Saskatchewan prior to their first League game.

Example:
i) An 18-year-old female player, who graduated from U18 the previous spring, received a three (3) game suspension during her last U18 game. That player is now trying out for the Regina Junior Female Team in the fall. As the player is trying to make the team, she is allowed to participate in preseason games up until the time of their first League game. Once league play begins, she would then start to serve her suspension.
g) Suspensions may only be served in regular scheduled league games, Hockey Saskatchewan playoff games or league playoff games and sanctioned tournaments where entry or scheduling is made prior to the suspension.
i) Suspensions for violations of the Hockey Canada/Hockey Saskatchewan rules and regulations must be served in the next game or games the player/team official participates in.
ii) Suspensions for violation of league rules (i.e.: accumulation of penalty minutes; misconducts; game misconducts; fighting majors; CFB's; HC's; etc.) may be implemented at the League's discretion.

Example:

1. A player registered with the Regina Junior $C$ team received a minor and misconduct for Head Contact in a game in January. No suspension is given for this penalty as per Hockey Canada minimum guidelines. However, the Junior C league gives the player a one (1) game suspension due to this being his $3^{\text {rd }}$ such penalty call this season.
h) Any suspension imposed upon any player, coach, or team official by the officials of any League or Association registered with Hockey Saskatchewan shall be given full recognition by Hockey Saskatchewan.

## I) Game Misconduct

i) In Junior C and Female Junior hockey any player or team official who is assessed a Game Misconduct penalty in the last ten (10) minutes of regular time, at any time in overtime, or after the conclusion of the game and prior to the player or team official entering the dressing room, shall automatically be suspended for the next regular scheduled league, playoff, Hockey Saskatchewan Provincial Playoff, or sanctioned Tournament game. Players receiving a game misconduct under this rule during their last game of the season must serve the suspension in their first league or sanctioned tournament game in the next season.
ii) Any Gross Misconduct in the last ten (10) minutes of a game receives an extra Game Suspension in addition to the suspension for the Gross Misconduct.
iii) Any Match Penalty in the last ten (10) minutes of a game receives an extra Game Suspension in addition to the suspension for the Match Penalty.
