# Hockey Canada

The following are some of the key recommendations from the report:

- The recruitment of Directors for the Board of Hockey Canada needs to be fundamentally rethought. A new approach to filling these positions is needed. All stakeholders will need to work together to bring these changes about.
- Achieve more balanced gender representation on the Board of Directors so that no more than 60% of the Directors will be of the same gender.
- Ensure the Board of Directors will include at least one athlete representative (defined as a person who is currently on a national team or competing at the international level, or who was on a national team or competed at an international level within the last 8 years).
- Ensure a majority of the Directors are Independent at the time of their election.
- The Board of Directors should be the group that appoints the Board Chair, using a well-defined process and pre-defined and approved eligibility qualifications (qualities and competencies).
- Board should continue to serve without remuneration.
- Minutes should be taken at all Board, Member and committee meetings by a designated resource.
- A schedule detailing the dates that regular Board meetings and Member meetings will be held should be posted on Hockey Canada's website.

## Update on Hockey Canada

### Hockey Canada Board of Directors

- There are still seven members of the Board of Directors who are completing their fiduciary duties as a Board Member, however none of the seven let their names stand for election at the Hockey Canada AGM which will be held December 17<sup>th</sup>.
- As of Monday, December 12, 2022, the Hockey Canada Nominating Committee released the names of who they are putting forward to the thirteen Branches that will serve as the Chair of the Board and the eight Directors within a one-year transition Board of Hockey Canada. The Branches met with the Nominating Committee this past Friday to review the nine individuals being put forward and to hear the process the Nominating Committee used to “vet” the 566 applications received from across the country.

# Hockey Canada

## Playing Rule 11.4 Discrimination Offences to Date this Season in Saskatchewan

- 40 total calls/allegations
  - 21 on ice calls reported by officials
  - 16 reports of allegations to officials to be investigated
  - 3 reports of allegations from coaches to be investigated
- 19 investigations of allegations
  - 6 allegations resulted in suspension
  - 8 allegations unsubstantiated
  - 7 ongoing investigations - 2 reports directly to ITP that don't fall within 11.4
  - Waiting for ITP response on 4 files

20 suspensions of 5 games or more

## Additional Playing Rule 11 Suspensions

### Since September 18

- 39 Coach Suspensions for 11.2 Game or Gross Misconducts
- 2 Coach Suspensions for 11.5 Threatening Officials
- 6 Coach Suspensions for their team receiving multiple 11.1/11.2 GM/Gross Misconducts

There are on average of 6 coaches being suspended every weekend of hockey so far for Playing Rule 11 Offences

# Officiating Program

# Other

## Community Rink Affordability Grant

A maximum of \$2,500 will be available per ice surface to help offset the expenses in eligible indoor skating and curling rinks for the 2022-23 operating season.

- Applies to indoor skating and curling rinks only. Outdoor facilities are not eligible.
- Requires that indoor skating and curling rinks have plans to install ice this season in order to be eligible.
- Is available to municipalities (urban and rural), First Nation communities, Canadian Forces Bases, schools and registered non-profit groups. Privately owned rinks are not eligible to receive funding.
- Applications must come from the legal owner of the facility (Facility Owner). For example: If the Village owns the facility, the Municipal Office will need to complete the Grant application.
- CRAG funds can be directed towards rink operating costs (i.e., wages, utilities), COVID-19-related expenditures (i.e., personal protective equipment for the facility) or minor capital improvements. Eligible costs must have been incurred between April 1, 2022, and March 31, 2023. Receipts or other documentation of expenses must be retained for potential auditing purposes.
