Playing Rule Amendments for 2024/25

At the Hockey Canada AGM there will be several Playing Rule amendments presented and voted on by the Member Branches. Following the meeting we will be able to provide a summary of the amendments that were approved and will take effect in the 2024/25 season.

There were several "housekeeping" type of amendments approved however beginning next season in Minor Hockey, twenty (20) players may be dressed per game as opposed to (19). This means in all of hockey from Minor through Junior to Senior, twenty (20) players may be dressed per game.





Annual General Meeting

The Hockey Saskatchewan Annual General Meeting is being moved to early August from the traditional June timeframe.

This provides more time to prepare and distribute the Audited Financial Statement of the previous year.

When new Directors are elected to the Board it allows them to immediately get involved within the Board of Directors as opposed to traditionally seeing a four to five week "down time" over the summer.

The change still complies with ISC Compliance and Sask Sport guidelines to carry out a AGM within four months of year end.

The date will be Tuesday, August 6, 2024, at 7:00 pm and will be held virtually.





Neck Guards

The Hockey Saskatchewan Board of Directors have approved a motion that requires all on-ice Officials to wear a BNQ certified neck guard when working in any league that requires players to wear neck guards.

This was effective as of Monday, November 20, 2023.

Notification was sent to all Officials immediately following the November Virtual Call.

This applies to all officials working the following:

- All Minor Coed and Female Hockey Games
- All Female Junior Hockey League Games
- All SJHL Hockey League Games





Neck Guards (Continued)

Hockey Saskatchewan, MHA's, participants (players and Officials), parents and coaches need to take ownership of this requirement.

A reminder will be sent to all officials after this meeting that the grace period for obtaining and wearing neck guards is over and they are required.

In addition, teams need to be aware of the consequences of them falling off or not being worn properly by players.





Neck Guards (Continued) - For Reference

Hockey Canada Playing Rules

3.6 (d) If the helmet, facial protector, or throat protector of a player comes off while play is in progress, the player will replace the piece of equipment (properly fastened) or will proceed to the Players' Bench for a substitution. If the player participates in play in any manner without that piece of equipment, play must be stopped immediately, and the player penalized under Rule **10.6 (a)** – Illegal Equipment.

Note 1: In the case of a player whose neck guard has come off, officials should make every effort to alert the player to this fact and direct them off the ice. If the player does not comply, then they must be penalized.

3.6 (f) If a player is wearing a helmet, facial protector, mouth guard or throat protector improperly, or wearing an uncertified piece of equipment, the Referee will penalize the offending player under Rule 10.6 – Illegal Equipment.

Note 1: The Referee is empowered to make the call without their attention being drawn by an opposing player or team official.





Neck Guards (Continued) – For Reference

10.6 (d) After one warning to the team, a Misconduct penalty will be assessed to any player who wears their helmet, facial protector, neck guard, or mouth guard improperly (Rule 3.6 (f) – Protective Equipment).





MHA Matching Grant Program – 2023/24

The Board of Directors have approved a MHA Matching Grant Program for the 2023/24 season in support of MHA's across the Province.

Support will be provided with the expense of hiring Power Skating Instructors or to have a local person trained to be a Power Skating Instructor to assist in Player Development with a matching grant of up to \$1,000.00.

One application per MHA will be accepted and the MHA must match the Grant received. The online application access will be made available October 15, 2023.

Power Skating services must be targeted towards the U7 to U13 age groups within an MHA and must have occurred from September 2023 to December 2023.

Power Skating Certification must be obtained by December 31, 2023. Online Applications to be received between December 1, 2023, and February 28, 2024

Power Skating instructors must possess the following certification in order for an MHA to qualify for the Matching Grant.

 - c) CanPower Skate Delivered by Skate Canada

 - e) Hockey Sask Skating Coach Two Clinics held August 13 in Saskatoon and October 29 in Caronport

Provincial Playoff Coaching Certification Reminder

This is a reminder of the new Regulation that was put in place last spring for team officials of teams entered in Hockey Saskatchewan Provincial Playoffs

Regulation 6.06.01 k)

"All Team Officials registered on a Provincial Team Roster must have the appropriate Team Official/Coaching certification/requirements."

Therefore, if a Team Official is registered as an Assistant Coach of a U13 team and does not have the proper coaching certification or Respect in Sport as an example, they will be deemed ineligible to participate with the team during Provincial Playoffs.





Community Rink Affordability Grant Program

Skating and curling rinks are integral to the creation of vibrant, active, and connected communities in Saskatchewan. These facilities play a critical role in health and wellness, at a time when that has never been more important. Recognizing the escalating operating costs communities and organizations face, SPRA has partnered with the Government of Saskatchewan to offer the Community Rink Affordability Grant.

A maximum of \$2,500 will be available per ice surface to help offset the expenses in eligible indoor skating and curling rinks for the 2023-2024 operating season
