New Board of Directors

The Nominating Committee of Hockey Canada reviewed all applications received and have recommended nine people to serve on the Board of Directors. At the Hockey Canada AGM on Saturday, November 18th the Member Branches will vote who of the nine candidates will serve one year, two year or three-year terms.

Three of the candidates are currently on the Board of Directors who were appointed to one-year terms last November.

Playing Rule Amendments for 2024/25

At the Hockey Canada AGM there will be several Playing Rule amendments presented and voted on by the Member Branches. Following the meeting we will be able to provide a summary of the amendments that were approved and will take effect in the 2024/25 season.





Annual General Meeting

The Hockey Saskatchewan Annual General Meeting is being moved to early August from the traditional June timeframe.

This provides more time to prepare and distribute the Audited Financial Statement of the previous year.

When new Directors are elected to the Board it allows them to immediately get involved within the Board of Directors as opposed to traditionally seeing a four to five week "down time" over the summer.

The change still complies with ISC Compliance and Sask Sport guidelines to carry out a AGM within four months of year end.

The date will be Tuesday, August 6, 2024 at 7:00 pm and will be held virtually.





Neck Guards

The Hockey Saskatchewan Board of Directors have approved a motion that requires all on-ice Officials to wear a BNQ certified neck guard when working in any league that requires players to wear neck guards.

This will be effective as of Monday, November 20, 2023.

Notification will be sent to all Officials immediately following this Virtual Call.

This will apply to officials working the following:

- All Minor Coed and Female Hockey Games
- All Female Junior Hockey League Games
- All SJHL Hockey League Games





MHA Matching Grant Program – 2023/24

The Board of Directors have approved a MHA Matching Grant Program for the 2023/24 season in support of MHA's across the Province.

Support will be provided with the expense of hiring Power Skating Instructors or to have a local person trained to be a Power Skating Instructor to assist in Player Development with a matching grant of up to \$1,000.00.

One application per MHA will be accepted and the MHA must match the Grant received. The online application access will be made available October 15, 2023.

Power Skating services must be targeted towards the U7 to U13 age groups within an MHA and must have occurred from September 2023 to December 2023.

Power Skating Certification must be obtained by December 31, 2023. Online Applications to be received between December 1, 2023, and February 28, 2024

Power Skating instructors must possess the following certification in order for an MHA to qualify for the Matching Grant.

 - c) CanPower Skate Delivered by Skate Canada

 - e) Hockey Sask Skating Coach Two Clinics held August 13 in Saskatoon and October 29 in Caronport

Community Rink Affordability Grant Program

Skating and curling rinks are integral to the creation of vibrant, active, and connected communities in Saskatchewan. These facilities play a critical role in health and wellness, at a time when that has never been more important. Recognizing the escalating operating costs communities and organizations face, SPRA has partnered with the Government of Saskatchewan to offer the Community Rink Affordability Grant.

A maximum of \$2,500 will be available per ice surface to help offset the expenses in eligible indoor skating and curling rinks for the 2023-2024 operating season

Provincial Registration Timeline:

- Applications opened on November 1st (\$75) on the Hockey Sask website (Presidents of Minor Hockey Associations only have access)
- Applications close at 5:00 pm on December 1st without penalty fee assessed
- Applications close at 5:00 pm on December 8th with the penalty fee assessed (\$150)
- After the Application is reviewed by Hockey Saskatchewan, a Provincial Roster Link will be emailed back to the Provincial Team contact. That Provincial Roster must be completed and submitted back to Hockey Saskatchewan by the following dates:
 - Female U13 December 15th
 - Minor December 20th
 - Senior December 30th
- All Provincial rosters will then be reviewed and approved after those deadlines (if there are any issues with a provincial roster, the team contact will be contacted directly from HS)
- All Provincial Draws will then be made and approved by the Hockey Saskatchewan Board of Directors in early January
- All Provincial packages will be emailed to each Team Contact shortly thereafter

Carded Team Registration Timeline:

- Applications open on November 1st (\$75) on the Hockey Sask website (Presidents of Minor Hockey Associations only have access)
- Applications close at 5:00 pm on November 15th
- After the Application is reviewed by Hockey Saskatchewan, a Carded Team Roster will be emailed back to the Carded Team Contact.
- The Carded Team Roster must be completed and submitted back to Hockey Saskatchewan by 5:00 pm on December 1st.
- As of December 1st, Carded Teams may begin to participate as explained in Regulation 6.04.16
- Carded Weekends are:
 - 2nd Weekend of December
 - 2nd Weekend of January
 - 3rd Weekend of February
 - o 4th Weekend of March
