### **MHA Matching Grant**

#### **MHA Matching Grant Program Returns for 2025-26 Season**

Hockey Saskatchewan's Minor Hockey Association (MHA) Matching Grant Program is back for the 2025-26 season. It will once again be in support of hiring power skating instructors or to have a local person trained to be a power skating instructor to assist in player development with a matching grant of up to \$1,000.00.

#### **IMPORTANT:**

- One application per MHA will be accepted and the MHA must match the grant received.
- Power skating services must be targeted towards the Under-7 to Under-13 age groups within an MHA and must have occurred from September to December 2025.
- Power skating certification must be obtained by December 31, 2025.
- Online grant applications <u>NOW</u> are open until February 28, 2026.





### **MHA Matching Grant**

Power skating instructors must possess the following certification in order for an MHA to qualify for the grant:

#### **Required Training**

Respect in Sport Activity Leader

Plus, one of the five designations below

a) Hockey Canada Certified Skills Coach (Level 3)

Delivered by Hockey Canada

Topics include: Skating, Skills, Defence, Shooting & Scoring

Hockey Network APP training

Application process to attend, hosted biannually by Hockey Canada

#### b) Hockey Saskatchewan Licensee

Recognized by Hockey Saskatchewan in these categories: power skating, skills, power skating, skills, checking, developing defence, goaltending.

Attend a Hockey Saskatchewan Professional Development training session





### **MHA Matching Grant**

- c) CanPower Skate Delivered by Skate Canada
- d) Hockey Saskatchewan Skills Coach Level
- e) Hockey Saskatchewan Skating Coach (NOW CLOSED)

Certification clinics held on September 27 in Saskatoon and on October 4 in Caronport.

Course material will be from Hockey Canada; Skating 1a, Skating 1 & Skating 2.

Ice sessions to target, edges, striding & transitions.

Additional class sessions include: use of technology, skill progressions & skill analysis.

10 lesson plans are being developed for attendees.





### Phase 2 of Where Fun Wins!

Hockey Saskatchewan has expanded the 'Where Fun Wins' Initiative into **Under-13 hockey** – a key step in the player journey.

- Focus remains on fun, development, and inclusion, while introducing new challenges:
  - Full-ice play

#### **Respect in Sport (RIS):**

The correct RIS course for coaches, trainers, managers, volunteers is **Respect in Sport Activity Leader.**

#### We do NOT accept these as substitutes:

Respect Officials (this is for referees/linespersons)

Respect Parent (the certificate will begin with SHAP, and this is credited to the child)

#### If you took the RIS course through another sport:

ONLY the coach/team official can import the certificate into the Hockey Saskatchewan RIS webpage.





How can I check my teams have all their coaching certifications?

To check your teams' individual certifications for: RIS, Coach 1, Coach 2, Checking, Development 1 or HP1, use the **Hockey Canada Registry (HCR).** 

MHA registrars' log into the HCR:

- Go to TEAMS and select a team from the list
- On the top right corner, then select VERIFY
- Scroll down the page to Qualifications
- Any certification that is green is OK
- Any tan-coloured certification is a deficiency, click on that item and it will open to show who
  is deficient


There are TWO TEAM certifications, these are Safety and Goaltending

One person on the team staff must have Hockey Canada Safety

One of the coaches must have Goaltending 1

Instructions on how to build a report for the TEAM certifications will be sent out to all MHAs







#### **Coach Mentorship Program:**

We are looking to support Minor Hockey Associations who operate their own mentorship program with training, resources & finances.

We have expanded our mentorship to include Under-7, Under-9 & Under-11.

Hockey Saskatchewan will support your own coach mentorship program in the following ways:

- Financial support: Hockey Saskatchewan's formula for payment example  $\rightarrow$  (# of U7 teams) x (2 visits per team) x \$75.
- Hockey Saskatchewan will provide one (1) Hockey Canada Network App code to each of your U7 team's head coaches.
- Mentor Training:
  - o In these areas: Hockey Canada Skating 1, Skills 1, Hockey Canada Network App, planning, Facilitator, CanPowerSkate, communication skills, coach evaluation, National Coaching Certification Program (NCCP) Mentorship.


#### Thanks Stripes Weekend – January 2 - 4, 2026
