Hockey Saskatchewan/Hockey Canada Per Participant Fees - REMINDER

As we have been reporting since September, Hockey Canada has been in discussion/negotiations with the thirteen Branches of Hockey Canada of what the Hockey Canda Per Participant Fees will be for the **2025/26 season**.

A decision was made by the Hockey Canada Board of Directors to increase the Per Participant Rate from the Current \$3 per Participant to \$10.00.

The following Regulation Changes were made as a result of the Hockey Sask AAA/AA Committee review and recommendations to the Hockey Sask Board of Directors:

Regulation 6.03.03 a)

 An amendment was made for Male and Female AA Hockey for U13/U15/U16/U18 only in that the move in date was amended from September 1 to July 1.

The cities of Moose Jaw and Prince Albert for Male AA Hockey are now open for all AA Hockey at U13/U15/U16/U18
