Hockey Canada

Hockey Saskatchewan/Hockey Canada Per Participant Fees

As we have been reporting since September, Hockey Canada has been in discussion/negotiations with the thirteen Branches of Hockey Canada of what the Hockey Canada Per Participant Fees will be for the **2025/26 season**.

A decision was made by the Hockey Canada Board of Directors to increase the Per Participant Rate from the Current \$3 per Participant to \$10.00.

Hockey Canada

Assessment	10.00
Sport Safety	4.50
HCR Fee	3.12
Taxes	1.02 (PST on Liability and D&O Insurance)
	42.43 (previously \$30.75)

As a result, we are projecting that the Per Participant Rate for 2025/26 will be \$67.00.

MHA Matching Grant Program – 2024/25

The Board of Directors have approved another MHA Matching Grant Program for the 2024/25 season in support of MHA's across the Province in the support of hiring Power Skating Instructors or to have a local person trained to be a Power Skating Instructor to assist in Player Development with a matching grant of up to \$1,000.00.

- One application per MHA will be accepted and the MHA must match the Grant received.
- Power Skating services must be targeted towards the U7 to U13 age groups within an MHA and must have occurred from September 2024 to December 2024.
- Power Skating Certification must be obtained by December 31, 2024.
- Online Applications can be submitted now and up till February 28, 2025
- Power Skating instructors must possess the following certification in order for an MHA to qualify for the Matching Grant.

***1st round of payments will be processed this week.

- Recognized by Hockey Saskatchewan in these categories: power skating, skills, Power Skating, skills, checking, developing defenseman, goaltending.

- c) CanPower Skate Delivered by Skate Canada
- d) Hockey Saskatchewan Skills Coach Level
- e) Hockey Sask Skating Coach November 2 in Caronport (First Clinic held in August in Saskatoon with 27 people in attendance)
- Course material is from Hockey Canada; Skating 1a, Skating 1 & Skating 2
- Ice sessions to target; edges, striding & transitions.
- Additional Class sessions include: use of technology, skill progressions, skill analysis
- 10 Lesson plans are being developed for attendees.

Reminder of the following! This is the Note following Hockey Saskatchewan Regulation 6.04.14

NOTE: Any coach, team and/or association found to be non-compliant with the U7 Cross-Ice format at any time during the season; or the U9 Half-Ice format; or the seasonal maximum game limits for U7, U9 and U11, will be subject to sanctions from both the Minor Hockey Association and/or Hockey Saskatchewan.

Sanctions may include but are not limited to:

Head Coach suspension

Minor Hockey Association (and members) not being able to enter Hockey Saskatchewan Provincial Playoffs.

Minor Hockey Association (and members) not being able to host any Hockey Saskatchewan sanctioned event.

Minor Hockey Association (and members) not being able to attend any Hockey Saskatchewan sanctioned event.

Minor Hockey Association's Hockey Saskatchewan membership reviewed.





Hockey Saskatchewan Registration Deadlines

February 10th

- Final date for ALL Registration (Hockey Canada Registry is locked)
- Any player released prior to January 10th from their current team...OR...a player that has not yet been registered on a team this season can still be registered on a team up until February 10th...PROVIDED...the team the player is being registered on has an open roster spot

Reconciliation of Registration

- If there is any request made to alter a call that was made during a game of to video review a situation that occurred, nothing can be amended/changed without the approval of the Hockey Saskatchewan Coordinator Discipline.

- A memo has been sent out to Leagues and MHA's to help clarify the process. The MHA President must sign off on the video submission – we strongly recommend the President reviewing the video before submitting it do ensure it is a legitimate request.

- k) All Team Officials registered on a Provincial Team Roster must have the appropriate Team Official/Coaching certification/requirements.
- This includes the AA/AAA leagues, these are provincial leagues and as such coaches must have the correct certifications to be rostered after December 20
- We notified all coaches who are missing Development 1 certification, a final DEV 1 clinic has been added on Jan 26 in Warman.
