Hockey Canada Per Participant Fees

This is to give Hockey Saskatchewan Members notice that there will be an increase in the per participant rate charged by Hockey Canada for the 2024/25 season. At this time, we do not know what the exact number will be, but it could increase from \$3 per participant to \$15 per participant. We are hoping a decision will be made by the end of the month, beginning of October so we can advise you.

When the World Junior Player "scandal" began, Hockey Canda had approximately \$130 million in the back. They are down to \$35 million, and their budget is in the \$40 to \$45 million and at time more in Olympic years. Sponsors have come back, and they expect to be higher than pre-scandal and the World Junior in Ottawa will be a significant revenue generator along with the Four Nations Cup event.

It is important to note that Hockey Canada, due to having large reserves were supplementing their Operations budget with interest earned on various "pillars" they had their money allocated to. That is no longer the case.

Whatever the increase is, we will advise you as soon as we can.

Educational Webinar Series based in Hockey Saskatchewan Values get underway next month. Stay tuned for presentations from:



MHA Matching Grant Program – 2024/25

The Board of Directors have approved another MHA Matching Grant Program for the 2024/25 season in support of MHA's across the Province in the support of hiring Power Skating Instructors or to have a local person trained to be a Power Skating Instructor to assist in Player Development with a matching grant of up to \$1,000.00.

One application per MHA will be accepted and the MHA must match the Grant received.

Power Skating services must be targeted towards the U7 to U13 age groups within an MHA and must have occurred from September 2024 to December 2024.

Power Skating Certification must be obtained by December 31, 2024. Online Applications to be received between December 1, 2024, and February 28, 2025

Power Skating instructors must possess the following certification in order for an MHA to qualify for the Matching Grant.





Required Training

- 1. Respect in Sport Activity Leader
- Plus one of the 5 designations below
- a) Hockey Canada Certified Skills Coach (Level 3)
- Delivered by Hockey Canada
- Topics include: Skating, Skills, Defenseman, Shooting & Scoring,
- Hockey Network APP training
- Application process to attend, hosted biannually by Hockey Canada

b) Hockey Saskatchewan Licensee

- Recognized by Hockey Saskatchewan in these categories: power skating, skills, Power Skating, skills, checking, developing defenseman, goaltending.
- Attend a Hockey Sask Professional Development Training Session





- c) CanPower Skate Delivered by Skate Canada
- d) Hockey Saskatchewan Skills Coach Level
- e) Hockey Sask Skating Coach November 2 in Caronport (First Clinic held in August in Saskatoon with 27 people in attendance)
- Course material is from Hockey Canada; Skating 1a, Skating 1 & Skating 2
- Ice sessions to target; edges, striding & transitions.
- Additional Class sessions include: use of technology, skill progressions, skill analysis
- 10 Lesson plans are being developed for attendees.



1. Official's Registration is Open

- This needs to be reviewed and shared with all you local officials as the requirements for all levels and ages is laid out on the website here. Please review so you can mange inquires on your end.
- Notes: All officials 15 and under will need to attend a classroom and ice session.
- Everyone must make the registration payment and prerequisites prior to signing up for a clinic.
- All new officials must complete the Hockey Canada Intro to Officiating Course.
- Intermediate and senior officials will do online modules and virtual clinics.

2. Watch for Clinic and recruitment poster, recruitment video and Facebook ads will be share shortly. Please make the most of these things and help spread the word to recruit officials.





Green Armband Initiative

- **Purpose**: The Green Armband Initiative highlights officials under 16, signifying they are young and still developing, with a focus on fostering respect from players, coaches, and spectators.
- **Rollout & Distribution**: Starting in September 2024, all officials aged 15 and under will receive their green armband at their in-person certification clinic. They will be required to wear it on their whistle arm, and it will become mandatory across the province by December 2024.
- **Increased Penalties**: Double penalties will apply for unsportsmanlike conduct and abuse towards green armband officials in the U7, U9, and U11 age groups.
- **Promoting Respect**: The initiative aims to shift the culture around how officials are treated, emphasizing the need for respect and education. The focus should be on creating a fun and abuse-free environment for everyone.
- **Support & Awareness**: Fans, players, and coaches can contribute by reporting abusive behaviour, educating others about the initiative, and sharing support on social media using the hashtag #SupportGreenArmbands.







3. New Provincial Assigning Structure

- Last season a new assigning structure was created and will be utilized again this season. It includes 9 assignors hired by Hockey Saskatchewan to assign Male U15AA, AA15, U18AA, Academy, U18AAA, Jr. C, Jr. B, Jr. A, Senior, Post-secondary officials as well as Female U18AAA, Junior and University.
- Any officials who should be considered for these opportunities need the local referee person, whether that is the assignor, RIC, senior official, whomever, to advocate for them and share their name and information so we can add them to our Arbiter assigning program.
- 4. Hockey Saskatchewan Game Fees, Mileage Rate and Ride Along Fees
- As mentioned earlier these are regulations, not recommendations and were created to create consistency throughout the province.

5. Local MHA Officiating Contact

- Finally, we need to ensure that each location indications who the local officiating contact is. These have not been updated for a few years and made it difficult to schedule clinics and confirm official's certification last season and need Minor Hockey Associations to take ownership of their officiating programs and communication and support provided.
- Please ensure your Officiating Contact is listed on the **MHA Registration Form** and includes the names and contact information for all individuals on your Board and their roles.
