MHA Matching Grant

5th MHA Matching Grant Program to Open for 2026-27 Season

For the 2026-27 season, Hockey Saskatchewan's Minor Hockey Association (MHA) Matching Grant Program is once again available to Minor Hockey Associations to be in support of hiring power skating instructors, or to have a local person trained to be a power skating instructor, to assist in player development with a matching grant. There have been changes to the grant program for the upcoming season that will provide additional funds for larger MHAs.

IMPORTANT:

- One application per MHA will be accepted and the MHA must match the grant amount received.
- Power skating services must be targeted towards the Under-7 to Under-13 age groups within an MHA and must have occurred from September to December 2026.
- Power skating certification must be obtained by December 31, 2026.
- Online grant applications will open in Fall 2026.

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MHA Matching Grant

New This Season

The grant amount will be based upon the number of registrations from the 2025-26 season; the larger the amount, the larger the grant that must be matched. The minimum grant amount remains at \$1,000.

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MHA Matching Grant

Power skating instructors must possess the following certification in order for an MHA to qualify for the grant:

Required Training

1. Respect in Sport Activity Leader

Plus, one of the five designations below

a) Hockey Canada Certified Skills Coach (Level 3)

Delivered by Hockey Canada

Topics include: Skating, Skills, Defence, Shooting & Scoring

Hockey Network APP training

Application process to attend, hosted biannually by Hockey Canada

b) Hockey Saskatchewan Licensee

Recognized by Hockey Saskatchewan in these categories: power skating, skills, power skating, skills, checking, developing defence, goaltending.

Certification clinics held on September 26 in Saskatoon and on October 11 in Caronport.

Course material will be from Hockey Canada; Skating 1a, Skating 1 & Skating 2.

Ice sessions to target, edges, striding & transitions.

Additional class sessions include: use of technology, skill progressions & skill analysis.

10 lesson plans are being developed for attendees.

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Hockey Canada | The Shift Forward

Hockey Canada has created a new online program, *The Shift Forward: Evolving Hockey Culture*, to replace the Respect in Sport (RIS) program that has been in place for years.

This Program is a new home for national education and training courses for sanctioned hockey in Canada.

For the 2026-27 season, courses will be available for new coaches, rostered staff, officials, parents and guardians.

As a new program to replace the Respect in Sport, Hockey Canada will continue to recognize existing certification from Respect in Sport and an equivalent as part of a multi-year phased-in approach before all participants engaging with hockey will be required to complete *The Shift Forward* beginning in the 2028-29 season.

The launch of *The Shift Forward* followed an extensive consultation process that included a training needs analysis to review national education and training courses, and this new platform will reflect the overwhelming feedback that the courses should be age-appropriate, modernized, engaging, specific to how participants engage with hockey, and be progressive as they go through their hockey journey, with content that seeks to change unhealthy behaviors on and off the ice.

Building Resiliency Program: 2026-27 Season

Target Audience: Parents and Coaches

Age Group Discussion Keys: Under-11; Under-13; Under-15; Under-18 and Junior

5 Module Dates: September 28; October 26; November 30; January 25; February 22

This five-module development strategy provides a framework for coaches and parents to develop mental performance skills to enhance overall mental health. The objective is to create resilient, confident, self-aware athletes who can perform under pressure, navigate adversity, and maintain a healthy relationship with sport throughout their hockey journey.

The model recognizes that mental performance and mental health are interconnected. Athletes who develop emotional regulation, confidence, purpose, and coping skills are better equipped to perform consistently and enjoy long-term participation in hockey.

Athlete development goes far beyond skills and systems. As players progress from U11 to Junior, the modules will discuss keys in building confidence to developing resilience, accountability, leadership, and wellbeing in each age group.

The goal of these sessions and modules is not simply to produce hockey players. It is to develop resilient, confident, mentally healthy young adults who can thrive in hockey and in life. It is to enhance the perspective of talent and development from the psychological lens.

- Tryouts for Under-16 AA can begin on September 1st with a registration deadline with Hockey Saskatchewan of September 9th

SEPTEMBER 8, 2026

- Registration deadline, by 5:00 p.m., for Under-18 AAA teams to register with Hockey Saskatchewan

SEPTEMBER 10-20, 2026

- Tryouts for Under-18 AA and Under-15 AA can begin on September 10th with a registration deadline with Hockey Saskatchewan of September 20th

SEPTEMBER 15, 2026

- Final date for all Minor Hockey Associations to complete their local registration

SEPTEMBER 17-27, 2026

- Tryouts for Under-13 AA can begin on September 17th with a registration deadline with Hockey Saskatchewan of September 27th

- **October 15**
 - Final date for all Minor Hockey Associations to register with Hockey Saskatchewan. By submitting the Association Registration Form and submitting all teams for approval on the Hockey Canada Registry (HCR).
- **November 1**
 - Provincial Playoff Team applications will open on the Hockey Saskatchewan website.
 - Carded Team applications will open on the Hockey Saskatchewan website.
- **Insurance Payments/Invoicing:** Invoices will/have be sent by email after the Association registration form is received. Payment can be accepted via credit card or cheque to the Hockey Saskatchewan office (#2 – 575 Park Street, Regina SK, S4N5B2).
- **Senior Hockey:** Training will take place in late September for all Senior Teams and Leagues on the Hockey Canada Registry.

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Registration Regulations

The Hockey Saskatchewan Board of Directors have approved a number of registration regulation changes. These will be distributed in the coming week; however, the following is a brief summary of the main regulations that were amended.

General Regulations – Definitions

- A number of new definitions added include: Branch; Coach; Discipline; Ineligible Player; Manager; Minor Hockey; Off-Ice Officials; On-Ice Events; On-Ice Officials; Playing Season; Pre-Season Games.
- **Regulation 3.06.04** – Some slight changes to some of the Officiating rates.
- **Regulation 4.06.01/6.06.01 a) i)** – The Provincial Playoffs entry fee has increased from \$75.00 to \$100.00.
- **Regulation 6.04.06 a)** – Teams in the AA category (U13, U15, U16, U18) must register a minimum of seventeen (17) players. Two (2) of the seventeen (17) must be goaltenders.
- **Regulation 6.04.05 U7/U9/U11** – Tournament and League games for U9 and U11 can begin as of **November 1st**.

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Registration Regulations

- **Regulation 6.04.16 j)**
 - Regardless of the size of a Minor Hockey Association, if the Minor Hockey Association Tiers their U9 or U11 teams, the first Tier is considered Tier 1.
- **Regulation 6.05.01 – General**
 - The use of affiliates (APs) should be based upon a team's needs in supplementing a temporary incomplete roster. Affiliate players should come from the same age division and a lower category whenever possible.
- **Regulations 6.05.02 a) iii) and b) iii)**
 - The wording in both Regulations that restrict second-year U15 players to playing five (5) games only has been removed for second-year U15 players affiliated to U18 AAA and U18 AA.
- **Regulation 6.07.03 b) i)** – Tournament Sanction fees have risen from \$25.00 to \$30.00 – the first increase in over thirty (30) years.
- **Regulation 6.07.04 b)** - A USA Travel Permit fee has risen from \$25.00 to \$30.00.

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Registration Regulations

- **Regulations: 4.09.04 a); 5.09.04; 6.09.04 a)**
 - Suspensions associated with Playing Rule 11.5 offences which are offences against Officials have been amended from an “Indefinite Suspension” to the following:
 - 11.5 c) i) Physically Threatens or Intimidates without making contact. Minimum 30 days
 - 11.5 c) ii) Deliberate Physical Force with a Minimum to Moderate Degree of Violence without Causing Injury. Minimum 31 days to a Maximum of 90 days
 - 11.5 c) iii) Deliberate Physical Force with a High Degree of Violence or Causes Injury to an Official by way of Intentional Contact. Minimum of 91 days to a Maximum of 180 days

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Registration Regulations

- **Regulation 6.09.04 d)**
 - i) Not Obtaining a Hockey Saskatchewan Sanction for an On-Ice Event
 - Penalty
 - Minor Hockey Association/Team that fails to sanction an On-Ice Event as defined in the General Regulations
 - Suspension
 - Penalties to be imposed by the Coordinator of Discipline against the MHA at their discretion and/or the Head Coach of the Team is suspended for one (1) month.
 - ii) An On-Ice event involving a Registered Team/Players/Team Officials and a Non-Sanctioned Hockey Program/Team/Players/Team Officials
 - Penalty
 - Head Coach of the Registered Team
 - Suspension
 - One (1) month.

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Registration Regulations

- **Regulation 8.01.01 b) viii)**
 - Head Coaches in U15 AA, U16 AA, U18 AAA and Sport Academies must be High Performance 1 certified. Head Coaches in U13 AA and U18 AA must be Developmental 1 certified.
- **Regulation 8.01.01 d)**
 - Respect in Sport is now the Shift Forward Program
 - If someone currently has the Respect in Sport – Activity Leader Qualification on their Hockey Profile in the Hockey Canada Registry, it will be accepted for the next two hockey seasons, expiring on June 1, 2028.
 - The charge to complete the online Shift Forward Program is a \$22.00, paid to Hockey Saskatchewan and then passed on to Hockey Canada.

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Registration Regulations

The following wording has been added to the **Non-Sanctioned Winter Policy**

- Teams

Teams registered with Hockey Saskatchewan cannot participate in On-Ice Events with Teams not registered with Hockey Saskatchewan in any capacity during the season whether the On-Ice Event is sanctioned or not.

The participation in On-Ice Events against Non-Sanctioned Teams creates considerable risk to Hockey Saskatchewan, its member Associations, Leagues and Participants along with Hockey Canada. Minor Hockey Associations and/or Head Coaches of registered Teams will be held accountable in the event of a violation of this procedure and disciplinary action will be levied by the Hockey Saskatchewan Coordinator of Discipline.

Coach 1, Coach 2, Checking & Goaltending 1 do not have an ice sessions, these courses are delivered online.

Development 1 course has two training components; online modules & attend in-person session. * * Development 1 is the required certification for head coaches in Under-13 AA, Under-18 AA & assistant coaches in Under-15 AA, Under-16 AA Under-18 AA & Under-18 AAA.

Coach 1, Coach 2 & Development 1 have pre-requisites and must be completed in the training steps order as listed.

EX: COACH 1

Skating 1 is the prerequisite to take Hockey Canada Coach 1 online.

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Coaching Development

The Shift Forward Program has replaced Respect in Sport:

If the Respect in Sport is on your hockey qualifications it will be accepted until May 2028, after which it will be retired.

There is a \$22 fee for the Shift Forward course.

AA/AAA certifications:

Reminder these are provincial leagues and as such coaches & team staff must have the correct certifications to be rostered after December 20th.

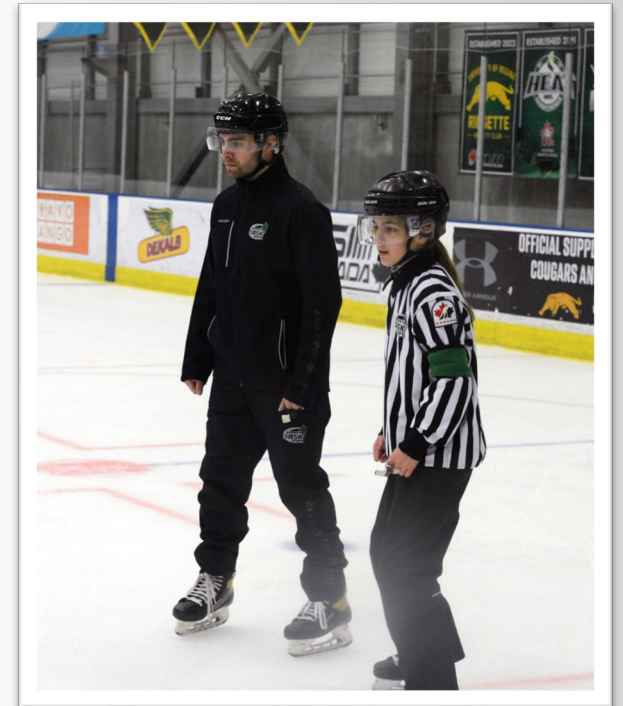

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Officiating Development Program

- **The NEW** 2026-28 Hockey Canada playing rules and points of emphasis for the hockey season have been sent out to leagues to share with coaches and teams.

- Delayed penalty situations
- U13 and below: when the goalie gets hit in the head with the puck
- Proper neck guards, helmets and 'cage hang'
- Focus on physical fouls with head contact standard

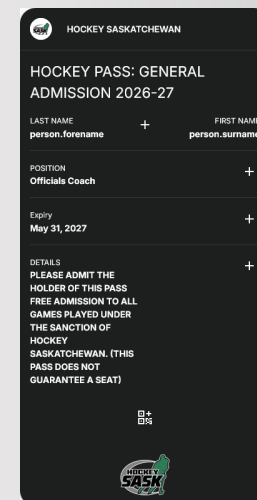
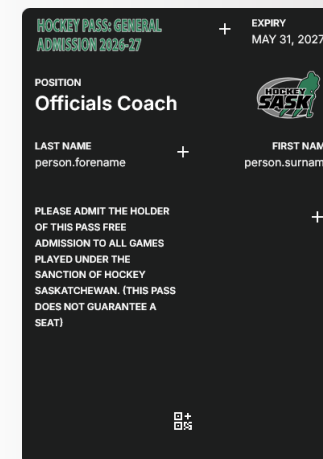
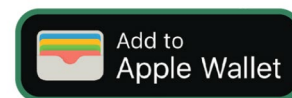
